West Sound Academy is a private, independent school committed to fostering the unique abilities of each student. Our IB-based curriculum empowers students to think critically, engage globally, and actively pursue their unique passions. For our students, learning is a journey. Faculty work to help students hone their critical thinking and analytical skills as they become resilient, innovative, and courageous individuals with the tenacity and brilliance to change the world for the better. Our goal is to help students leverage their passion for learning and be prepared to excel in college and beyond.

WSA is located in Poulsbo, WA on the Kitsap Peninsula. Poulsbo is a small suburb in Kitsap County, located 21 miles west of Seattle across the Puget Sound, and adjacent to the Port Madison Indian reservation. Students come from both Kitsap and Jefferson Counties.

Admissions and Enrollment

Total enrollment: 90 students
Fifteen faculty instruct
students in average class sizes of fifteen.

The application process requires a student to visit, interview, and submit letters of recommendation and a writing sample. We admit students who are internationally minded, demonstrate intellectual curiosity, and are excited about learning. The student population includes economic, ethnic, linguistic, and neuro diversity. Our community is focused on inclusion and creating a welcoming environment for the whole student.

IB Diploma Programme

We are an International Baccalaureate Diploma Programme school. All students in the 11th and 12th grades are enrolled in International Baccalaureate classes. Students choose to submit materials to IB for consideration for the full IB Diploma or for Course Subject Certificates. Theory of Knowledge is required for all 11th-graders and 12th-grade Diploma Candidates as part of the IB Core.

- In the class of 2025:
 - 100% are submitting materials to IB
 - $\circ~$ 63% are submitting for the full IB diploma
- In the class 2024:
 - 90% of the students who submitted materials for the full diploma, earned the IB Diploma.

Since the first IB class in 2013, 90% of our candidates have earned the IB Diploma. The average score for those awarded the diploma is 31.

Grading

We do not rank students due to the rigorous nature, small class size, and commitment to supporting the whole person.

- We report individual grade point averages.
- GPA calculation is unweighted on a 4.0 scale.
- Transcripts reflect IB courses by title.

Calendar and Schedule

The academic year consists of two semesters and a three-week term in June (June Term). During the semesters, students take seven classes. The schedule operates on a rotating block, with 90-minute class sessions. During June Term, students select one full-day or two half-day (180 minutes each) experiential learning courses.

Community Service Experience

The school requires students to plan, initiate, and execute multiple service projects that fill a wider community need each year. As part of that, in the 11th and 12th grades, the IB Diploma Programme requires candidates to engage in Creative, Active, and Service experiences. These extracurricular opportunities are explored by our students inside and outside of the classroom setting.
